

NONFATAL SHOOTING/GUN VIOLENCE REDUCTION ASSESSMENT

Subject matter experts (SMEs) will conduct a site visit to meet with personnel from appropriate agencies to assess and review existing policies, procedures, and practices. During the assessment, SMEs will do the following:

- Make general observations about the nonfatal shooting investigative process.
- Collect relevant data, such as crime reports and analysis; calls for service; policies and procedures pertaining
 to investigations; forensic services; case management systems; and intelligence sharing.
- Identify opportunities to enhance nonfatal shooting investigations and the prosecution process.
- Develop recommendations and provide feedback related to nonfatal shooting investigations.

Goals and Objectives

- Assist local gun violence prevention efforts.
- Organize an efficient, productive agency response to identify and prosecute active, at-large, high-risk offenders.

TTA Format: Available in person and virtually

Intended Audience (local personnel to participate in the assessment)

- · Executive command staff
- Commanders, analysts, supervisors, detectives, investigators
- Prosecutors, homicide trial prosecutors
- Federal counterparts involved in gun violence investigations and prosecutions

Length (estimated time to completion)

- Two-to-three-day site visit.
- SMEs will deliver an assessment report approximately one month after the site visit.

Agenda

- Meetings with the above local personnel
- Tour of police department and crime lab, and other facilities as appropriate
- Review of open and closed investigation case files
- Review of crime data, policies, procedures, and other documents related to the criminal investigations, crime analysis, intelligence, and forensic processes
