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PSN SPOTLIGHT: US DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE PROGRAM AWARDS

In October 2024, the US Department of Justice announced that it awarded \$4 billion to bolster public safety initiatives supporting five justice priorities: 1) promoting safety and strengthening trust, 2) accelerating justice system reforms, 3) improving the fairness and effectiveness of the juvenile justice system, 4) expanding access to victim services, and 5) advancing science and innovation.

GRANTS SPOTLIGHT BY JOAN BRODY: FIVE-PART GRANTS WEBINAR SERIES

Dear Grant Seekers,

Yes, it's November already and the fiscal year (FY) 2025 grant season is just around the corner. You may be sick and tired of hearing me talk about being proactive and strategic, but I keep repeating this mantra because it will help you acquire more grant funding with less stress. If you can pinpoint your agency's priorities now, and start preparing your approach and proposal in advance, when the relevant grant solicitation drops, you will have already done the heavy lifting. It will be a piece of cake to write and submit your application.

Below, I am including links to a short and sweet tutorial about how to develop a "grant strategy", which is just a fancy name for a wish list. Your grant strategy will help you answer the most common question I ask grantees "What do you want to buy?" Everyone wants funding, but delving into the details of what you want to buy—and why—is foundational to successful grant seeking.

For help developing your FY 2025 grant strategy, I encourage you to watch or re-watch the on-demand video series that I helped create a few years back for PSN.
