PSN aims to bring together all levels of law enforcement and the communities they serve to reduce violent crime and gun violence. This year, the Eastern District of California has led several successful cases, supported in part by PSN.

Multiple law enforcement agencies in Fresno County conducted an investigation focused on crimes of violence, drug, sales, and illegal firearms possession that resulted in the execution of 54 search warrants and the arrest of 25 criminal street gang members and associates. ## GRANTS SPOTLIGHT BY JOAN BRODY: FILLING IN YOUR GRANT STRATEGY

This month, I am showing you how to fill in your Grants Matrix, which is just another name for your Grant Strategy. As a quick refresher, after you hand out your Grant Idea Sheets and you review the returned forms, you will be able to start populating your Grants Matrix.

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#### **GRANTS SPOTLIGHT, CONTINUED**

The examples above came from Grant Idea Sheets of a detective and a member of the IT team who are part of the internal grants working group. They asked their colleagues and supervisors about priority needs. Their answers were then transferred from their returned Grant Idea Sheets to this chart.

The last column was filled in by the lead of the grants working group by searching the USDOJ Program Plan, federal and state websites, Google, and Grants.gov. If your agency has developed public-private partnerships via a foundation or corporate giving program, you can also search private funding databases.

Please note that the grants listed in the potential funding column will be edited as additional grant intel is released by grantors. I will provide additional tips in the coming months for how to search for information about future grant solicitations.

But first, next month, I want to show you how to use your Grants Matrix to write short "concept papers" that you can then send up your chain of command to receive early project approval and share proactively with potential funders.
